HOLIDAY HOURS

Township Offices will be closed from December 26 through December 30, reopening on January 2. Voice mail and e-mail messages will be checked during this time, calls returned and appointments scheduled as needed. The Supervisor may be reached on his mobile phone (501-2288), the Sexton at 349-2638 and the Building Official at 365-3766. Messages for the Building Department may be left at 382-3366.

Many Township forms are located on the Township website. Completed forms may be mailed, faxed or dropped off (a drop slot is located to the south of the office door handle for use during non-office hours). Tax and assessment information is current and posted on the Township website.

Winter taxes are due on or before February 15, 2012 without penalty. After this date, taxes are subject to a 3% late fee and may be paid to the Township through February 29, 2012 after which time payments are subject to additional penalties and must be paid to Kalamazoo County. **Summer (2011) taxes** may be paid to the Treasurer until February 29; residents must call to obtain the amount of late fees that must be included with the payment. Summer taxes paid after February 29 must be paid to Kalamazoo County.



RECYCLING

Recycling resumes on **March 10** at the Township Park on DE Avenue from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. Additional bins will be available to accommodate the recyclables that residents store all winter in anticipation of the recycling program beginning its new year. Thank you to everyone who takes advantage of the program, reducing the amount of useable materials going to landfills. This service is funded by the Township and is free to Township residents. The Township accepts clean mixed paper/cardboard, cans (remove paper and flatten), tin foil, newspapers, clear glass and plastic (#'s 1, 2, 3 & 5, no bags). Please separate newspaper (including inserts) for the Scouts. A complete list of acceptable materials is on the Township website. Curbside recycling is available from local waste haulers.

SAVE THE DATE: The next **Junk Day** is **May 12**. Information will be published in the March newsletter in terms of what is and isn't accepted.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

The Township provides funding to the **Household Hazardous Waste** program to allow residents free use of this County service. Please take advantage of the program by disposing of used oil, household hazardous waste plus old TVs and computers.

ELECTION NEWS

Four elections are anticipated in 2012:

- February 28: Presidential Primary
May 8: State and County Proposals plus
School Board elections are possible.
August 7: Primary
November 6: Presidential Election

Precinct 2 will be voting at the Alamo Community Church (7925 North 6th Street), just north of the Township Hall. **Precinct 1** will continue to vote at the Township Hall (south side).

Registered voters age 60 and older can be placed on the Township's **permanent absentee voter list** when requested. Once placed on the list, an absentee ballot will automatically be mailed to the registered voter prior to each election. Please contact the Clerk if you wish to be placed on the permanent absentee voter list. Absentee ballots may also be requested by persons of any age when the voter will not be able to vote in person on Election Day.



MUSEUM

Brian Smith, Museum Curator, has done an outstanding job of renovating the displays as well as staffing the Museum during the times it is open to the public. If you are interested in donating an hour or two (or more!) to staff the Museum, please contact Curator Smith or Ron Feniger (phone numbers on page 3.) The Museum is open one weekend per month May through October.

FIRE & RESCUE

Thank you to everyone who helped in this year's very successful Alamo Fire Fighters' **Holiday Food Drive**. Six families in need will receive a holiday meal plus food for their cupboards for the upcoming winter. Because of everyone's generosity, food was also donated to other organizations that maintain food pantries.

With the heating season well underway, this is a good time to check your **smoke detectors' and carbon monoxide detectors'** batteries and to make sure the units are still operating.

Fireplaces and wood stoves are designed to safely contain wood-fuel fires while heating your home. Creosote is a common by-product of fires. Creosote is highly combustible and can lead to chimney fires. You can **avoid chimney fires and creosote buildup** by only burning seasoned wood (dry wood is a more important consideration than hard vs. soft woods). Burn smaller, hotter fires that burn more completely. Do not burn paper, trash or other materials in your fire place or wood stove. It is recommended that your chimney be cleaned and inspected by a certified chimney sweep on an annual basis. Chimney fires can turn into structure fires very quickly and with almost no notice. If you experience a chimney fire, get everyone out of the house and call 9-1-1.

Alamo Fire & Rescue is looking for men and women with a desire to serve and protect the community. Fire Academy, medical training and equipment are provided by the Township. **Applications** may be downloaded from the Township website. TOWNSHIP BOARD

In September, the Township Board approved the Planning Commission's recommendations for revisions to the Outdoor Furnace Ordinance. Residents may now operate **outdoor furnaces** all year. A permit must be obtained to install an outdoor furnace and it must meet a minimum of the EPA Phase II standards.

The Supervisor is participating in discussions concerning the feasibility of establishing a fire authority amongst a number of surrounding townships. This is in the very early stages of discussion and no decisions have been made.

The Township Hall has received a facelift! Offices have been built on the north side of the Hall and two additional offices will be constructed in early January on the south side. As a result of the renovations, the Township Board made the difficult decision to stop renting the south side of the Hall.

The Board is currently reviewing roads within the Township and will be selecting which roads will receive work in 2012 no later than its February meeting. As is no secret, Township roads need more upgrades than there is funding to support. Because the Township is in solid financial shape, some funds may be redirected to road maintenance to prevent them from failing. Rebuilding a failed road runs close to \$160,000 per mile. The Township Road Management Policy was approved in June of 2009 and is available on the Bulletin Board page of the Township website.



PLANNING COMMISSION

In January the Commission will be attending a seminar that will allow the most current laws to be incorporated into a revision of the Township's **sign ordinance**.

At the request of the Township Board, the Commission is updating the **noise ordinance**. The Township's current noise ordinance has been in place since 1974. Opinions are varied in terms of the desired content of the ordinance. This year's Winterfest will be held February 11 from 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. It will include the second running of the Alamo Park Loppet cross-country ski race and a snowball softball tournament. Lee's Sporting Goods of Kalamazoo will be on hand to provide cross-country ski demonstrations and will have rental skis available. The Park Board runs a "donate your cross-country skis" program.
