Economic impact data (Culture Satellite Account)

- ▶ Direct economic impact of the arts, culture, and heritage
 - Culture industries perspective examined here for comparability with other sectors
- Provincial estimates were released in June 2015
 - ► Analyzed by Hill Strategies in August
- Canada: \$53.4 billion in 2010
 - ▶ 3.4% of Canadian GDP
- ▶ 707,000 jobs
 - ▶4.1% of total employment

Economic impact data (Culture Satellite Account)

- ▶ B.C. estimates
- ▶ \$6.1 billion in 2010
 - ▶ 3.2% of B.C. GDP
- ▶ 94,800 jobs
 - ▶4.1% of total provincial employment

Economic impact data (Culture Satellite Account)

- ▶ B.C. estimate of \$6.1 billion in 2010
- Larger than value added of ...
 - ► Sport (\$919 million)
 - Agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting (\$3.2 billion)
 - ► Utilities (\$4.0 billion)
 - Accommodation and food services (\$5.5 billion)


Macro-level data on B.C. cultural participation

 - Reading books


% of provincial residents visiting at least 1 art gallery in 2010




% of provincial residents attending at least 1 classical music performance in 2010




% of provincial residents attending at least 1 theatre performance in 2010





Concentration of artists in Canada's provinces and territories, 2011




Concentration of cultural workers in Canada's provinces



► A relatively high % of B.C. residents (15 or older) volunteer for and donate to arts and culture organizations




Arts and culture volunteer rate and overall volunteer rate by province, 2013
