Roma Young People Attend a Youth Residential

Devon Adventure Week is a youth residential taking young people from deprived urban areas to the North Devon countryside for a week of physical & spiritual adventure. This year, for the first time, 3 Roma youths from Luton were able to participate. The residential was a wonderful experience for the Roma boys; opportunity to socialise with young people they would never otherwise meet; engaging in Bible study & themed discussions at a depth that just would not happen at home in Luton. The boys loved it! They thrived.

There were 2 highlights: first was the generous hospitality shown by Christchurch United Reformed Church in Clacton; second was the time of shared fellowship, including singing, reflections & poetry. Whilst enjoyable in itself, the trip was not simply a day for everyone to do their own thing, but an opportunity to further develop the sense of being the church together.

Bishop's Cup Annual Inter Faith Cricket Tournament

On 3rd August in Watford Town Cricket Club, teams from Luton, St Albans and Watford played friendly cricket, with lots of family fun and inter faith fellowship. Watford were the winners, and Luton was runner up.

Health& Wellbeing Day

In Luton's Blenheim Baptist Church Hall, a recorded attendance of 75, majority women, comprising of English, British, Irish, Pakistani, Indian, African/ Caribbean and European ethnicities, enjoyed activities e.g.; Tai Chi, Yoga, Pilates, Meditation, Alexander Technique, Hand Therapy, Reflexology, Head & Hand Massage and Circle Dancing. Individual health checks relating to weight, body fat, body water and BMI (Body Mass Index) were also available. Ghar se Ghar (Home to Home) groups are also a place where women can meet regularly, feel part of a community, thus combating social isolation.

Near Neighbours (NN) Programme Launch Event

The Project was officially launched in the presence of MP Stephen Williams, Parliamentary under Secretary of State for Department of Communities and local Government on 6th July. Work with other NN Partner organisations is also developing. On 15th January 2015 GRASSROOTS Luton will host the NN National meeting. So far, out of 10 NN funding applications from Luton for small grants, 7 have been successful, 15 ideas are yet to be discussed and 11 activities are at the application stage. Fairtrade Eid Hampers

We created Fairtrade Eid Hampers for Mosques and other key Muslim organisations and individuals, ethically tackling poverty and empowering people on the ground in places like Palestine. Lots of these hampers priced £15, £25 & £35 were bought by various people. We also raised money to plant olive trees in Palestine.

“Embracing a Diverse Community” – A week Residential at OTHONA

Othona is an open and welcoming Community in Bradwell on Sea (www.othona-bradwell.org.uk) Essex. Through a daily rhythm of work, learning, worship and play, it seeks personal renewal and glimpses of the sacred. From Mon 28th Jul - Fri 1st Aug 2014, Grassroots led a week on OTHONA based upon our work across different faiths and cultures in Luton and its ups and downs. Ann says, “My session on ‘Darkness and Light- The Highs and Lows of Living in Luton’, attempted to give a balanced picture of the positives and negatives which are the reality of living in my hometown of Luton today. I also had a Circle Dance session, based on “The Creation”, a suite of dances choreographed to classical music and linked to Genesis.”

Annual Peace Walk

The 18th Annual Peace Walk in Luton was held in Farley Hill, coinciding with the 30th International Peace Day. Over 200 people of all ages from different faiths and cultures enacted a model of peaceful co-existence, building resilience & community cohesion, not uniformity but promoting unity in diversity. A photographic presentation from the ‘Faith, Camera, Action, Luton’ project was popular. In it, Lyndsay Baker had shared some common themes emerging in pictures of Luton’s Central Mosque and All Saints Church. The day ended at St. John the Baptist Anglican Church with a magnificent spread of an English Afternoon Tea served by a multicultural team of volunteers from the Reconciliation Walk Community based at the Church. Fruit bushes were also planted at The Vicarage garden by representatives of different faiths.

Dates for your Diary

East of England Fairtrade Conference is taking place on Saturday 18th October 2014. With a Fairtrade producer, leaders in the Fairtrade movement and Fairtrade campaigners from across the region and country, this is an event not to be missed. Please do put the date in your diary!

UN Day is being organised by UNA-Luton Branch with support from GRASSROOTS and LUTON COUNCIL OF FAITHS, on 31 October 2014. The University of Bedfordshire has agreed to give a suitable venue free of charge. Sir Jeremy Greenstock, President of the United Nations Association, UK, has agreed to come as our keynote speaker.

Community Archery Games is taking place on Sunday 2nd November at Luton Sixth Form College. These games are intended to bring Luton’s diverse faith communities together preceded by a training workshop led by Danielle Brown MBE (double Para-Olympic gold medallist in archery and three times World Champion). The event will aim to attract those who do not usually engage in inter-faith work, in a fun filled competitive day of learning and sport.
