## Community Relations & Issues in Luton

The EDL (English Defence League) gathered in Luton's Park Square on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2014 to protest against Islamic extremism. While the EDL presence was quite small, a counter demonstration in the Bury Park area was organised by UAF (Unite Against Fascism) working alongside a group called 'We Are Luton'. Members of GRASSROOTS and Luton Council of Faiths were part of a team of Community Mediators working alongside Bedfordshire Police, Community Chaplains, Pastors and Street Pastors. Although the day passed by peacefully, there is a level of concern and anxiety within the community regarding the distress that such demonstrations cause time and again. In response, GRASSROOTS reaffirms its commitment to working with the many different communities in Luton to promote harmony and facilitate constructive discussion where possible.

## Other GRASSROOTS News

### Catholic School Chaplaincy & Inter Faith Dialogue

On 15th October 2014, Sr Maire Hayes led a Catholic School Chaplaincy and Inter Faith Dialogue training day. The training aimed to encourage Chaplains of Catholic schools to live out the teachings of Vatican II, acknowledging that we are all God's family and that we have our destiny in God. During the day participants explored how we can all grow distinctively in dialogue with others without needing to feel we must compromise our own identity, faith or culture.

### Fairtrade Supporters Conference

The Luton Fairtrade Steering Group, with the support of GRASSROOTS, Luton Council of Faiths and the University of Bedfordshire, hosted the Fairtrade Supporters' Triennial Conference on 18th October 2014. Held at the University, the hugely inspiring day was packed with exciting and inspirational talks, craft activities, and a fair and funky Fairtrade snack cook-in corner. The day also included an art activity using seeds from Fairtrade dates, a buzzing market-place displaying a range of Fairtrade products and a role play performed by children from St Joseph's Catholic Junior School.

### Community Archery Games

On 2nd November 2014, the Community Archery Games took place at Luton Sixth Form College involving over 100 people from Luton's diverse communities. The day began with a special training workshop for local Archery Instructors led by Danielle Brown, MBE - double Paralympics Gold Medallist in Archery, Commonwealth Games Gold Medallist and three times World Champion. The event continued with a friendly community archery competition, with proud winners awarded gold, silver and bronze medals.

### The Robin Hood Feast

This exciting event took place on 12th November 2014 celebrating a successful year of the Community Archery Project. Organised and supported by Luton Council of Faiths, GRASSROOTS and the Near Neighbours programme, the feast brought together archers and their families from across faiths and cultures for a social evening including traditional games, archery and an educational quiz. Around 60 people took part in the celebration held in the hall of All Saints Church, Bury Park, which had been decorated medieval-style.

### A Grand Christmas Dinner and Dance

The Bury Park Beech Hill Council of Churches hosted a Christmas extravaganza on 5th December 2014. Held at the Holy Ghost Catholic Parish Centre, guests enjoyed a 3-course meal, entertainments and a night of dancing, with proceeds from the event supporting the Church Related Community Work (CRCW) project. More than 100 people from across the Council of Churches, plus invited family and friends, donned their finery and gathered for this wonderful occasion, sharing fellowship and strengthening friendship.

### Circle Dancing Christmas Special

Ann Hyde led a Circle Dancing Christmas Special at Hockwell Ring Community Centre on 6th December 2014, supported by New Creations. 30 attendees enjoyed dancing to music new and old, with dances including the Nut Cracking Dance from Romania and the Shepherds Dance from France among many others. Participants brought along food to enjoy, encouraging much sharing, conversation and laughter.
