### Holocaust Memorial Day

GRASSROOTS colleagues were involved in the planning of the Holocaust Memorial Day event which took place at Luton Town Hall on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2016. Candles were lit to commemorate the 11 million victims of the Holocaust, students from Stopsley High School performed a moving sketch on Bullying and there was also a deep reflection on the 'Impact of Slavery on African Caribbean Communities'.

### Britain First Patrol

Britain First returned unannounced to Bury Park, Luton, on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2016, provoking the local community and causing unrest, whilst filming material to make an anti-Islamic propaganda video. Luton's Church leaders responded the next day by visiting Bury Park on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2016 to denounce the actions of Britain First and share the message of peace.
