Several hours later, we wrapped things up at 5 pm and dragged bodies home. Needless to say - a new lesson well learned!

The next Noodle-making day is scheduled for June 10th and we promise to make a reasonable amount of dough so that we can go home and relax by 2 pm.

1885

The minutes for 1885 are quite scant...

May 12 (Semi-Annual Meeting)

- Statistics for the past year were distributed.
- Monies from Synod are still to come.
- The Council presented for discussion, a proposal to build a 3-family building in the play of Wray's shed.

October 13

- A newsletter is to be written and circulated.
- A new organist and choir director will be paid \$120 per annum, on probation.

November 10 (Semi-Annual Meeting)

- There will be no new construction.

1886

January 5

- Pastor Ongerth has asked for a \$125 advance to move his mother and young siblings to California where his father has emigrated. Five members of the congregation have agreed to advance \$25 each interest-free for 6-months, to be paid back quarterly, deducted from Pr. Ongerth's salary.
- 12 small and 6 big hymnals will be ordered.

April 2

- There was only 1 item on the agenda - the new site for the church. The Council plan to sell the church property and move to a better part of town.
- The promissory note to the City and District Savings Bank of \$250 will be paid off gradually.

May 11 (Semi-Annual Meeting)

- Pastor Ongerth presented his statistics.
- Secretary Drechsel presented his report. The membership increased from 40-45.
- A reimbursement from the Synod is not yet possible as they are currently involved in a court case.
- The move to sell the property, buy new land to build a church and manse in a better part of town - expected cost is \$7,000. The committee - G. Reinhardt, Studer, Briegel (for 6 months) will look into this further.

May 11 Continued

- Newly elected officers are: Messrs. Heinrich (President), G. Reinhardt (Treasurer) Simm (Secretary).

September 15

- The rental of the church was discussed. Pastor Massey holds English evening services and will now have to pay \$14 extra for firewood.
- The Ladies Auxiliary asked to organize a tea party for Germans in Montreal.
- Repairs to the roof and chimney are needed.

October 13

- The City of Montreal has asked for payment of drainage. The committee petitioned the Chairman of the Finance Committee, City of Montreal for an exemption or an extension of the deadline. The City agreed to a 6-month deadline extension.

November 9 (Semi-Annual Meeting)

- Monies from Canada Synod not yet received.
- Have not received an acceptable purchase offer for the building.
- Missionary Dr. Baedeker will give a guest sermon in German church.
- Mr. Studer has suggested that the asking price for the church property be lowered to \$6,000.

December 29

- A new sexton is to be hired. Until then, Council members will take turns carrying out the sexton's duties.
- Pastor Ongerth has asked that the toilet and bathroom, which are in an unbearable state, be relocated. This work will be deferred until the spring.
