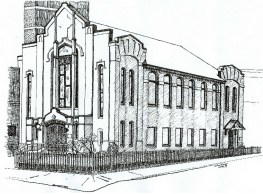

A glimpse into our past...

Translations prepared in 2000 by Gisele Steinle. Interesting extracts selected by Katherine Hedrich are featured below

1905

January 17 (Annual General Meeting)

- The church's financial situation has improved. A balanced budget was presented.
- The Riedel monument was unveiled. The voluntary contributions to the monument netted a surplus. The widow Riedel was present at the unveiling and all her travel costs were reimbursed.
- The \$34 surplus will be used to purchase church books.
- Organist Pabst was hired permanently for \$80 per annum.
- A change in the constitution was approved. The Church Council (Board) will consist of 8 elders who will elect a president, vice-president (pastor) and secretary. The elders will be elected for a 3-year period and the election will take place during the Annual Meetings held in January.
- The Pastor was instructed to let the Synod (meeting in Boston) know that no interference by the newly founded English Lutheran Church (Pastor Bieler) will be tolerated.

July 11 (Semi-Annual Meeting)

- The budget is balanced and there is a slight surplus.
- The Pastor reported that there was interference from the English Lutheran Church and that measures were taken. He cannot take the issue to the Synod as our church is not a member.
- The council proposed that our church join Synod and tabled the proposal for a vote at the next Annual Meeting.

September 18 (Special Meeting)

- The church property will be put up for sale for \$30,000.

1906

January 16 (Annual General Meeting)

- The budget remains balanced and there is a slight surplus. Thanks to the Ladies Aid for their contribution.
- Pastor Jestinsky proposed a change to § 18 of the constitution. He proposed that there not be more than three times the number of candidates than offices to be held.
- He presented a plea to the congregation that the church become a member of the Synod. The vote was postponed to the semi-annual meeting to be held in July.

June 5 (Special Meeting)

- An offer to purchase the Church Property for \$20,000 was accepted. Unfortunately, the sale did not go through through.
