

Connecting your LinkedIn profile



During the activation process, you will have the option to connect a LinkedIn profile to your LinkedIn Learning account. If you do not have a LinkedIn profile, you can create one. The benefits of signing in with a LinkedIn profile include:

- **A more personalized learning experience** that includes special course recommendations for you based on job title, skills, and industry.
- **Discoverable and relevant learning content** within the LinkedIn.com experience (e.g., in the feed) to keep learning top of mind and drive more engagement.

When you connect your LinkedIn profile, you can rest assured that only your learning data will be shared with your employer. No other data from your LinkedIn profile will be accessible or shared. 
Or if you choose not to connect your LinkedIn profile, you will create a separate LinkedIn Learning account that is not connected to LinkedIn.com.


Once the upgrade is completed, there are two different entry paths to activate your LinkedIn Learning account.

or

Click activation link in learner experience on Lynda.com when are you signed in to Lynda.com



You can either choose to connect your LinkedIn account.


or

Create a separate Learning account.




When you choose to connect your LinkedIn account:

Log into your LinkedIn account.



First step:


Click "Not a member? Join now".

Second step:

Complete the form to create a new account and click "Join now."





Fourth step:


Review the privacy policy and click "Accept and continue" to connect your LinkedIn Learning account.

or

When you choose to create a separate Learning account:

Enter the email used for your existing Lynda.com account to receive a verification code.



Enter the pin you receive via email in order to verify your account.



Create a new password.
