

'It's been an extraordinarily disorienting past few years to write about art' opens Ben Davis's latest and second book, Art in the After-Culture: Capitalist Crisis and Cultural Strategy
(Haymarket Books, April 2022). Davis originally titled this book Making Art in Terrible Times, but had to pivot slightly in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, which not only delayed the book's publication but also informed its content. The resulting collection of essays grapple with the reality of what it means to make art in a time marked by political sectionalism, environmental catastrophe and seismic new technologies – and together they act both as an elegy for culture as we once knew it and a foreshadowing of a new mode of artistic production.
