Reviewed draft PIC Activity Status Report (attached). Discussed current outreach and education activities, water quality monitoring, remediation, and enforcement. The bulk of the meeting was spent on water quality monitoring. It was suggested that we get more detailed information about the Kitsap County monitoring program, such as the structure of their database and cost estimates for operating the program (perhaps a per sample cost that includes everything from sample collection to analysis).

Ed Chadd said that relying on volunteers for ambient monitoring at all stream mouths could be problematic if they are expected to monitor beyond regularly scheduled dates, such as extra sampling during rain events. Streamkeepers is currently doing 15 samples per day and could do 20. It is easier to recruit volunteers with a good monitoring plan and purpose. Ed needs 1-2 months to get database functional with current data.

Lab tests cost about \$25 per sample. The County lab may have capacity limitations if sampling is increased substantially.
