Colorado Springs, Colorado

Georgia's Capitol is brimming with history, culture, art, shopping and new memories in the making. See where the 1996 Olympic Games were hosted at Centennial Olympic Park. Visit the 33-acre Atlanta History Center's museum, historic houses, gardens and trails. Take a personalized test drive at the Porsche Experience Center. View the nation's only giant panda twins at Zoo Atlanta. Head to the LEGOLAND Discovery Center with the kids to see an exclusive new LEGO movie. And for foodies and outdoor enthusiasts alike, the walkable and bikeable Atlanta BeltLine has miles of unique restaurants, shops and neighborhoods.


Kalispell, Montana

Kalispell's abundance of outdoor activities means year-round family-friendly adventures. Just 32 scenic miles away is Glacier National Park. Take the grandkids to see interactive exhibits at Betty Brinn Children's Museum. Browse the Historic Third Ward, known as "Milwaukee's Arts and Fashion District." Don't forget the spectacular Milwaukee Art Museum, which is home to more than 30,000 pieces of art.



Dallas, Texas

From The Sixth Floor Museum commemorating JFK's assassination to historical parks and award-winning eateries, there's something for every member of your family to explore in Dallas. Zero Gravity Thrill Amusement Park is perfect for the thrill-seekers in your group. For kids, the Perot Museum of Nature and Science has animations, simulations, games and interactive experiences. Check out the Dallas Museum of Art – General Admission is free. Walk through the unique Bishop Arts District with its restaurants, coffee shops, galleries and boutiques.
