

Michigan State Police partnering with truckers to fight human trafficking

Michigan State Police Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Division (CVED) have teamed up with truckers to stop human trafficking.

Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) has developed a program to educate members of the trucking industry while on the road.

“As the eyes and ears of the nation’s highways, this initiative is calling on the trucking industry to help in the fight against human trafficking by reporting any suspicious activity to the National Human Trafficking Resource Center, said Captain Michael Krumm, commander of CVED.

“We want to educate and create awareness among the trucking industry on the basic issues involved in human trafficking.”

The plan:

- Provide human trafficking awareness training to all MSP motor carrier officers
- Train district coordinators to work directly with truck stop managers to present training to carriers and make direct contact with truck drivers

- Distribute 17,000 TAT wallet cards and other materials to truck drivers, carriers and travel plaza managers
- Provide TAT posters to the Michigan Department of Transportation to place in all Michigan rest areas and welcome centers
