Landing on a different continent and not knowing a single, solitary soul... Don't you just hate it when that happens!

That's precisely what I experienced on August 30, 1985, when I deplaned onto the tarmac at Brisbane Airport in Queensland, Australia. I had just arrived in the country for a two-year missions apprenticeship that I was to serve with a man and his family that I had never personally met. We had corresponded by mail off and on for about a year and a half as I was finishing up my undergraduate studies at Lipscomb University. Just a few weeks earlier we had spoken on the phone for the very first time. Incredibly, exchanging photographs of one another in our correspondence was something that we had never thought to do. Neither of us had any idea what the other looked like.

This was actually the second time I had arrived as a newcomer on a different continent, so there was some déjà vu involved. In April of 1973, my family and I deboarded a plane in Monrovia, Liberia, where my parents had committed to serve as missionaries. Africa was a strange, exotic new world to a 10 year-old boy, but at least I had my Dad, Mom, and sister with me. It was in Liberia that I read every word of the extensive entry on Australia in the World Book Encyclopedia and began to dream of going there one day. Twelve years later, I arrived Down Under as a 22 year-old with two suitcases, a foot locker, and a camera bag, knowing that it would be 24 months before I caught a flight back to the U.S. I must have looked rather lost and desperate to make eye contact with someone who looked like they were looking for someone they didn't know. I can't tell you what a comfort and relief it was to see a broadly smiling face and hear the question, "Are you Tim?"

There are people in our assembly this morning who are feeling like they have landed all alone on a continent on the other side of the world. Maybe they are here for the very first time. Maybe they are a new member. Maybe they have been a part of this church family for some time, but, for whatever reason, still feel like a disconnected stranger. Commit yourself today to provide the smiling face and the warm welcome that they long for and need.
