



# FA 21/02/00417 - Travel Exemptions

### Question:

- 1. International workers with a 457 or 482 visa who successfully applied for an exemption enabling them to re-enter Australia despite the travel ban.
- 2. International workers with a 457 or 482 visa who unsuccessfully applied for an exemption enabling them to re-enter Australia despite the travel ban.
- 3. Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who successfully applied for an exemption enabling them to re-enter Australia despite the travel ban.
- 4. Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia who unsuccessfully applied for an exemption enabling them to re-enter Australia despite the travel ban.

I'm seeking access to the statistics/numbers for all of them but seek further information, specifically the reason why and where they were applying from for points 1 and 4.

#### Answer:

Australian citizens and permanent residents are automatically exempt from restrictions on travel **to** Australia (that is, re-entering Australia).

Between 1 August 2020 and 4 February 2021, there were 14,837 travel exemption requests finalised where the applicant declared they held or had applied for a Temporary Work (Skilled) (subclass 457) or Temporary Skill Shortage (subclass 482) visa.

Travel exemption data cannot be disaggregated by visa subclass prior to 1 August 2020, when processing of travel exemption requests moved to the Travel Exemption Portal.

#### Of these requests:

- 6,173 were approved
- 6,214 were refused
- 2,450 were otherwise finalised\*

\* Otherwise finalised includes those found to meet an existing exemption category, withdrawn requests, duplicates and those that did not include enough information for consideration by a decision maker.
