As Maine becomes a destination for climate migration, communities across the state are dealing with housing shortages and increased prices that are out of reach for many Mainers. Missing middle types that fit into the fabric of our villages, towns, and cities, as well as new neighborhoods tied to community centers, are a great way to increase housing options close to jobs and services. Join other active and aspiring small scale developers to learn strategies and pro tips for how to build missing middle housing types in today's challenging construction climate. This workshop will share insights into building codes, finance, building and site design, and details on new financing programs that are available from MaineHousing to help unlock the potential for small but mighty projects. The workshop will also include a walking tour of several local buildings.

#### TOUR: HISTORICAL WALKING TOUR OF SKOWHEGAN ISLAND

#### Tour will depart from 7 Island Avenue

Skowhegan's fourteen-acre island in the mighty Kennebec River served as a seasonal resting place for Native Americans and for Benedict Arnold's Expedition in 1775. Tour participants will explore how our early settlers harnessed the energy created by the natural waterfalls to manufacture doors, sashes, caskets, furniture, pulp and paper, flour, dress hoops, skates, hammers, axes, manhole covers and other goods to meet the needs of this growing community. As the water wheel transitioned to turbine generated electricity, the industrial revolution brought good jobs in manufacturing textiles that were shipped worldwide. Join local historian and former History House Director Melvin Burnham as he leads this walking tour through Skowhegan history on Skowhegan Island.

#### TOUR: BICYCLE TOUR OF SKOWHEGAN DOWNTOWN + RIVER TRAIL Tour will depart from 7 Island Avenue

Join us for a bike ride around Skowhegan on a route envisioned as a key commuting and recreational network for residents and visitors of all ages and abilities. Help test this idea of a "Neighborhood Byway" and provide feedback on the route, which includes a mix of low traffic neighborhood streets and unpaved trails. The ride will also take participants to key destinations including the downtown, historic residential areas, and dramatic river crossings over the Kennebec on Skowhegan's famed pedestrian bridges. Bring your own bike, or take your chances on the limited supply of bikes we will have available.

#### **TOUR: MAINE GRAINS GRISTMILL TOUR**

#### Meet at Miller's Table at Maine Grains for lunch. Tour will depart from there.

Maine Grains is housed in the historic former Somerset County Jail building, which is also the home of the Miller's Table Café, Crooked Face Creamery, Happyknits yarn shop, WXNZ community radio & the weekly Skowhegan Farmer's Market. The mill has been an engine of entrepreneurship and resides in the heart of historic downtown Skowhegan. During the tour you will learn about the unique history of Maine Grains, the process of transforming a jail into a mill, how stone milled flour is made and what they are hoping to accomplish in the years to come. We'll tour the facility from the bottom up, so you can see our team of talented millers at work and the beautiful Austrian stone mills busily humming away, transforming whole grain into beautiful & delicious flour.

#### TOUR: TACTICAL URBANISM IN ACTION

#### Tour will depart from 7 Island Avenue

Join the Bicycle Coalition of Maine, Toole Design, and MaineDOT for a walking tour to observe and learn about the new quick build traffic calming installations - all put in place by workshop participants the day before the conference. See the power of inexpensive materials - such as paint, bollards, and planters - and observe how these surgical street improvements can slow traffic and improve the experience of walking around the downtown. A speed gun will be on hand to measure vehicle speeds.
