Important Playschool Information

• Parent Handbook

Please take the time to review the Parent Handbook so you are familiar with Playschool's operations, routines, policies and procedures.

Police Clearance

Our playschool relies on parent helpers to maintain the required adult/child ratios for licensing. Police Clearance is MANDATORY for all parent helpers. Police clearance of at least one parent or adult who will be completing parent helper shifts at the Playschool must be received prior to the child commencing Playschool. If you need to complete a police clearance, please do so at https://policeinformationcheck.calgarypolice.ca/ and "share" the results with HHBH Community Association. Please contact Erica McBeth, Privacy Officer/Class Liaison at ericamcbeth@live.com (ClassLiaison@playschool.hh-bh.ca after mid-September) if you have questions or have a valid police clearance from elsewhere. Please note that it can take several weeks for a police clearance to be processed.

Parent Volunteer Commitment

Our school depends on the involvement and participation of parents. Each family is expected to complete Special Helper Days in the classroom, as well as sign up for a job in one of the four Non-Executive Parent Committees: Teacher Support Committee, Social Events Committee, Classroom Enrichment Committee, and Cleaning Committee. Please familiarize yourself with the parent volunteer expectations before the start of school (*Section 3.2 Volunteer Commitment to Support Operations* in the Parent Handbook).

• Sign Up Genius

The Playschool will be utilizing Sign Up Genius to allow parents to sign up online for all required volunteer commitments. More information regarding volunteer requirements and how to use Sign Up Genius will be sent to parents on **August 15**th.

• First Day Of Class

For your child's first day:

- Please ensure you know which day your child should arrive (see Staggered Entry below)
- You will receive a registration form and waiver one week prior to school. You will need to print off the registration form/waiver, ensure all information is correct, and bring with you on the first day.
- Please plan to stay for at least the first 10-15 minutes for paperwork/introductions

• Staggered Entry

Staggered entry will occur the first week of classes.

- Children enrolled in the morning class will visit for one, full 2 ½ hour class between September 7th-12th
- There will be no staggered entry for the afternoon class: regular attendance begins September 7th
- September 13th/14th will be the start of regular attendance for children in the morning classes
- Your child's assigned staggered entry day will be sent by email on August 15, 2017.

• Fall General Meeting

Mark your calendars, The Fall General Meeting will be held **Tuesday**, **September 12th at 7 pm** in the Playschool Classroom. It is mandatory that at least one family member attend. Please see *Section 6.4.1 Orientation Meeting – September* in the Parent Handbook for more information regarding this meeting.

Speech and Fine Motor Screening

The Playschool is partnered with IM4Kids, a community based, early intervention program that provides developmental screening and on-site therapy support. The IM4Kids Team will be available to HHBH Playschool children to complete developmental screens on September 15, 2017. If you choose to participate, an occupational therapist and speech language pathologist will meet with you and your child and present your child with a set of age-appropriate activities. The therapists will observe your child's approach and skill level and review with you their clinical impressions. If warranted, further assessment may be recommended. If you believe your child would benefit from a developmental screen, please be sure to pick up an IM4Kids information package and sign up for an assessment time at the Playschool on the first week of classes.

Important Classroom Logistics

Playschool Access

In compliance with CBE policy, all doors at Briar Hill School are locked at 8:40am and remain locked throughout the day. There is a buzzer at the Playschool entrance that parents can use to access the building.

Releasing Children

- A teacher or Parent Helper will open the school entrance door at 11:30am and 3:30pm
- 2-3 children will be called forward to meet up with their authorized parent/guardian in the hallway
- To ensure safety/security, do not take your child or "wave" your child out
- Your patience is appreciated as we become familiar with the adults authorized to pick up your child.
- Please review *Section 5.11 Child Pick Up Policy* and *Section 5.12 Late Pick Up Policy* in the Parent Handbook so you are aware of the Playschool's pick-up policies.

Snack Expectations

- The Parent Helper will provide a healthy snack from two different food groups, for all children in the class
- Briar Hill School has a No Nuts/No Peanuts policy and the playground is a "Food Free" zone
- Every day, children need to bring a clean water-filled water bottle clearly labeled with their name
- Please review *Section 4.3 Nutrition/Snack Expectation* in the Parent Handbook to familiarize yourself with the snack expectations. Please note that many of our policies are determined by Alberta Health, Child Care Licensing and/or the Calgary Board of Education.

Shoes/Clothing

- Children need to wear supportive shoes that allow them to move safely in the classroom and the gym.
- Children need to have a suitable sweater/coat each day in case of outdoor play or fire drill/evacuation
- Shoes can be left in your child's cubby. The Playschool is not responsible for lost/stolen items
- Please keep an extra set of clothing/underwear in your child's backpack in case of accidents, spills...etc.

Helper Days

On your Parent Helper day, you **must arrive** <u>10-15 minutes</u> before the program start time, for a briefing on the day. Please respect the teachers, children and other parents and arrive on time for this preparation. Parent Helper role and expectations will be reviewed at the Parent Orientation Meeting on September 12th. **Please thoroughly review** *Section 3.1 Volunteering in the Classroom* (*In-Class Helper*) for a more detailed outline of the Parent Helper role and responsibilities.

Show & Tell

- The child of the Parent Helper is the Special Helper Child that day and can bring **ONE** show & tell item.
- Suggested items are: a favorite book, science item, toy or souvenir. Violence related toys are not allowed.
- 10-15 minutes each class is allocated for show & tell; to facilitate development of listening and speaking skills, for both the special helper child and their classmates.

Birthday Information

- On a child's birthday, s/he will get to wear a birthday sticker and the class will sing Happy Birthday
- Often parents will try to plan to be the Special Helper on or close to their child's birthday
- Due to parent feedback, we ask that <u>cupcakes are not brought to class</u> as the snack on your child's birthday. Licensing requires that <u>healthy</u> snacks from two different food groups are provided.

Important Classroom Logistics

- Parents may stay with their child on the first day (or few days) to ensure the child is comfortable.
- Discuss expectations: your child needs to know that s/he will need to remain at the school without you.
- Our teachers are experienced and well-prepared to help your child with separation anxiety. They will let you know if the separation is too difficult for your child and together we can come up with a plan.
- ALWAYS say good bye to your child BUT be careful not to drag out your departure as this can make the transition more challenging.
- If it helps with the transition, your child may bring a special/security item (like a blanket or a stuffy) until s/he is more comfortable at school. The teachers need to be aware of the item to reduce the chance of it being lost or broken. Once your child is comfortable, all special/security items need to be kept at home.
