

Pedagogical Value

- Centers allow a teacher to work intensely with a small group of students while their classmates complete differentiated activities in small groups.
- The teacher-led group receives targeted instruction while the rest of the class develops self-discipline and collaboration skills. (See more at Scholastic, LearningRx, and ABCTeach)

How Classkick Enhances Centers

With Classkick, a teacher can monitor and provide feedback to students in all centers from a single iPad – all without leaving his or her small group table!

Prepare and Post Classkick Assignments

- Form groups of students based on recent assessments.
- Create Classkick assignments to address their needs and record class codes at each center.



Set Expectations

- Review center rules as the first question in each assignment.
- Keep a chart to track students and post class codes next to the assignment name.
- Instruct students to:
 - ask each partner before raising hand in Classkick
 - continue checking for bell notification to see feedback you provide.
- **Practice transitions** (remind students to write unanswered questions in Classkick assignments and to carry iPads with two hands).



Monitor and Give Feedback in Classkick

- Sort assignments by "last used by students" and tap "View Student Work."
- Give feedback to students with raised hands to get a group unstuck.
- Glance through students' work every five minutes to prevent incorrect practicing.
- Encourage and monitor student collaboration by enabling student helpers in Classkick.



Reflect and Discuss

- Create exit slip on what students learned in a Classkick assignment that tracks responses over entire year (for example: AM1 TP1).
- Assign exit slip to students after they complete all centers.
- **Discuss** things that went well and things that need to be improved for the future.
