## President's Report Larry Modean

One of the major concerns for the Pike Lake Area this year has been the fate of the AAA Recreational Area. We will hopefully have some closure of this situation by the time of the Fall Banquet. We are planning to have the banquet on Thurs. the 19th of October. It will be held at the Cast Iron Grill, who has been our gracious hosts for the previous two banquets.

Roger and Dianne Anderson have made an offer that AAA has accepted for the recreational area. An environmental study has been completed and the Andersons are waiting for AAA to provide a clear title. The Andersons have a preliminary written plan for the area. They recognize that this property, which has been available to the public for over a hundred years, is a community asset and holds great sentimental value to many people. They, of course need to recoup their investment.

The plan would keep the golf course and the beach open and available to the public. A limited amount of housing would be developed adjacent to the golf course. WLSSD has been contacted and the amount of housing that can be accepted by WLSSD has been negotiated. The housing would probably require some modification of the golf course. They are also planning to demolish the existing storage and clubhouse buildings. A new multi-purpose event center which would include concessions plus would be built. This is a plan we hope would keep this unique community asset functioning and available to the entire community. We will invite the people most knowledgeable of this situation to attend and be available to speak at the banquet. It

would also be fun to have some of our historians share their knowledge of this community center.

About the banquet, we need more of the younger people from the area to attend. The more active members we have, the more credible are our thoughts and viewpoints.

## Pike Lake Area Association July 4th Celebration Tom Whitaker

Dianne Ahlers, our very talented and hard-working Director of Special Events organized, staffed, and implemented a very successful July 4th breakfast against all odds. The AAA closed our long-time venue, the Auto Club Caddy Shack and cut off access to their picnic tables. Diane didn't miss a beat. She worked with Kevin Comnick, Canosia Township Supervisor-and a great friend of the PLAA, to get the okay to hold the breakfast in the newly paved Canosia Town Hall parking lot. The Canosia Volunteer Fire Department offered us the use of their kitchen. Diane rented tables and chairs and recruited an excellent group of volunteers including her husband Steve, children Breanna and Connor, the Swanstroms, the Modeans, the

Ogstens, the Vosses, the Mirsches, the Wallaces, the Whittakers, the Rauschenfels, Jean Nisius, Kathy Tanski and others. She put them to work setting tables; cooking eggs, sausages, pancakes and other goodies. We were worried that the change of venue would limit the attendance. Not so! We gave nametags to 273 people, and based on our observations, missed about 10% of the attendees. In short, the PLAA crew fed about 300 people. Those people donated \$860 and more than 100 pounds of food to the Proctor and Great Harvest Food Shelves. We also sold 10 PLAA memberships. A remarkable event. The celebration continued with the Riley Boat Parade. Sue Modean counted over 50 boats! There was one complaint. The parade has evolved into a spirited naval battle featuring water balloons and water cannons, ship to shore bombardments, and vice versa. Most people love the action, but an elderly nonparticipant got hit in the head with a water balloon. She didn't appreciate it. In the future, we encourage people to focus their energy on active combatants.

The day ended with great fireworks, albeit less than in previous years. Frank Messina decided to sit this one out. We are working on him to resume participation next year.

We have a chloride study that is ongoing, and we a have a UMD student that's going to do a "risk assessment" on Pike Lake with an educational component for area residents". It is still in the planning stages and too early for a report.

## 2017 Landing Inspections

The 2017 public landing educational inspections are underway. The Pike Lake Association is very grateful for Canosia Township's management of the program. Please thank your Canosia Township Supervisors. The total budgeted hours for 2017 are \$1200 for Pike Lake and \$800 for Caribou Lake. The program is staffed by eight certified inspectors managed by Alyssa Hagemeyer. The inspectors received all day training and were tested on Saturday May 6, 2017, at the Canosia Town Hall. All inspectors were given a written exam and were required to score 80% or higher to become certified. The training was done by Jessica Moore of the MN DNR. She is an AIS Trainer. Also on hand was a MN DNR officer, who brought a boat to the training site. This allowed the inspectors to have firsthand training on what, and where, to look for invasive species. We will be publishing the results of the AIS program after all the data has been collected for the year.

### **History Corner** Sue Voss

Since I joined the Canosia Historical Society I have been asked, "What's up with the Canosia Cemetery?" I looked it up on their web site and learned it was incorporated in 1890 on land donated by local folks. Article does not mention who donated the land. It has two large pillars at the entrance on Midway Rd. just off Hwy.53 and Seville Rd. The driveway leads up to a Veterans' Memorial with tall flagpoles, a plaque with old and recent veterans names on it. Benches are also included and the flags are lighted up. This was an Eagle Scout project. Some of the stones have been eroded by weather and can better be read by rubbings. The first settlers in 1875, the Michels, are there. All the names I have heard mentioned in the early records such as Peterson, Brindos, Butler, Kolojeski, Daniels, McCrimmon, plus many recent neighbors, and friends, and politicians.

A few of the victims of the tragic 1918 fire rest there.

The Cemetery is open to the public.
