General Scholarship – Due February 16, 2017

Carolyn Matthews Memorial Scholarship – Due February 16

Amount \$1250

The Carolyn Matthews Memorial Scholarship is a scholarship awarded to a student based on his or her involvement with school and community service activities, character and academic record.

- Students must be **nominated by school guidance counselors from the Twin Tiers** where the Star Gazette is distributed with letter included with application– **ONE NOMINEE PER SCHOOL.**
- Nominees should be students who might not be the top scholar in the senior class but who have made a difference in their school, family and community.

Elizabeth Amisano Ovarian Cancer Education Fund Award- Due March 2

Amount 2 at \$1000 each

The Elizabeth Amisano Ovarian Cancer Scholarship is a one-year award given to two students, male or female, **who reside and attend school or are home-schooled in Schuyler County.**

- A “C” or above scholastic record
- Evidence of good citizenship
- Evidence of a firm desire for further education.
- Demonstrated belief in the good in all people
- Evidence of a sense of humor

Kappa Men of Corning-Elmira Alumni Scholarship – Due March 16

Amount Varies

The Kappa Men Scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior from the following school districts: Bath, Corning-Painted Post, Odessa-Montour, Spencer-VanEtten, Watkins Glen, Owego, Waverly, Elmira, Elmira Heights, and Horseheads, New York.

- Demonstrate desire, interest, and leadership
- Financial need
- **Preference will be given to people of color, with a preference for African American men.**

Robert and Sharon Petrillose Memorial Scholarship – Due February 23

Amount \$1000

This scholarship is to recognize a graduation student from **Elmira, Corning or the Finger Lakes area of New York accepted to Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration.** The student shall be selected based upon academic achievement, work ethic and interest in food and beverage industry. **In the event that no local students have been accepted into Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration, the selection committee can choose a local student accepted to Cornell University.**

Twin Tiers Youth for Christ Scholarship – Due March 16

Amount \$4000 (1 male and 1 female)

The candidate must be a **Christian whose high school is located in or they have been a resident of Chemung County or an adjacent county for over six months.** The student must be enrolled or will be enrolled in an accredited four-year college or university and must obtain a recommendation from a pastor of a "Christian Church". Candidate must complete the Twin Tiers Youth for Christ Scholarship Application.
