### **SYNOPSIS**

### The play begins shortly after the coronation of England's King Henry V.

The Bishops of Canterbury and Ely discuss a proposed law that would be financially ruinous for the church. As a diversionary solution, the Bishop of Canterbury has suggested to King Henry that he make a claim to the throne of France. Canterbury makes this case to the King and his court and, despite his many complicated historical references, convinces the King of his rightful claim to the French crown. Montjoy, a French messenger, returns a message from the Dauphin (the French prince) with a gift of tennis balls, an insulting reference to King Henry's wayward youth. Henry promises war.

Before becoming king, Henry was indeed known to keep low company. His former friends, Pistol, Bardolph, Nym and the Boy, bicker and commiserate in Hostess Nell Quickly's London tavern while their ringleader, John Falstaff, lies sick on his deathbed. As the King uncovers a murder plot at the outset of his French expedition, his former tavern companions mourn the death of Falstaff and likewise set off for France and conquest.

In France, the English successfully seize the town of Harfleur. Pistol begs the Welsh captain Fluellen to help seek a pardon for Bardolph, who is facing execution for stealing from a church.

Fluellen declines to help. Montjoy returns a message that the French, chastened from this loss, vow a strong military response. The King, learning of Bardolph's theft, also denies him clemency.

On the eve of battle the English are badly outnumbered, sick, and exhausted. Henry disguises himself to walk among the English soldiers and stumbles upon Williams, who forcefully questions the morality of Henry's war. Williams, unaware he's speaking to the King, agrees to a duel should the two men survive the coming battle, and they exchange gloves to confirm the others' identity if they meet again. The King prays for victory before returning to his lords and brothers. Facing a demoralized army, Henry rallies the English leadership and denies to Montjoy the offer to be saved by ransom. They enter the battle.

After its conclusion, Fluellen encounters Pistol, who has taken to mocking Fluellen for the Welsh tradition of wearing a leek. Fluellen, intent on a vigorous rebuttal, forces Pistol to eat his leek. Pistol, noting that the Hostess Nell Quickly has died, declares he will return to England to live by theft and fraud.

King Henry V died shortly after the events of this play. The conquered land was retaken by the French, and England was beset by civil war.
