
CEO'S MESSAGE

2013 MARKS THE STRONGEST NEW MEMBER GROWTH IN 40 YEARS FOR THE UTAH LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TRUST.

In 2013, the Trust added 36 members bringing 84 new lines of insurance to the pool, for \$1.7 million in new premium. Not surprisingly, growth in the first quarter of 2014 is already at 45% of last year's total. Size, retention, and growth are key measures of organizational health, long-term viability, member satisfaction, and value. Member retention is at its highest level in 40 years – running at 99.6%. Consistent growth and retention allows the Trust to deliver more for less, in addition to providing needed flexibility. Growth and diversity in membership strengthens the pool. The Trust provides financial security and long-term sustainability to 545 members: cities and towns, counties, and special service districts.

In 2013, fluctuations in financial markets had a negative impact on the mark to market value of the Trust investment portfolio. Despite unrealized portfolio gains or losses, market value fluctuations are eliminated as bonds mature. Still, operating income for 2013 was \$2,062,351. The Board of Directors authorized a dividend of \$1,991,119 paid to members of the liability pool. The Trust leverages size and diversity for the benefit of members. Financial strength allows for the expansion of coverage, improvements of terms and conditions, and security for sustained growth and expansion.

Proudly serving the unincorporated areas in Salt Lake County and the Cities of Taylorsville, Cottonwood Heights, Holladay, Herriman, and a portion of Murray.

In 1977, the Salt Lake County Commission formed the District. Before 2013, the District was operated as an enterprise fund within Salt Lake County. The Salt Lake County Council served as the District's governing body until 2010. At that time, the County Council created the Administrative Control Board, comprised of elected city and county officials.

In 2013, Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District became a stand-alone organization responsible for sanitation employees, district assets, and the majority of administrative functions, including risk management. Our partnership with the Trust provides:

SOUTH VALLEY
SEWER DISTRICT



The South Valley Sewer District was established in 1961 to provide sanitary sewer to the southern portion of Salt Lake County.

The South Valley Sewer District is responsible for the collection and treatment of sanitary sewer for the cities of Bluffdale, Draper, Riverton, South Jordan, Herriman, the southern portion of Sandy, and the unincorporated portions in the southern end of the Salt Lake Valley (including Copperton). A new state-of-the-art MBR treatment facility, Jordan Basin Water Reclamation Facility, came on line in 2012. Since the first pipes went in the ground in 1972, growth has been the major challenge and opportunity for the District. The Trust has been an integral part in meeting the needs of the District.

- District covers 107 square miles
- 865 miles of sanitary sewer in the ground
- Over 61,000 customer accounts (50% built)
- Treatment of 16.2 mgd and growing
