

## CEO MESSAGE

In 2015, the Trust added 50 new members to its pooled programs and \$554,426 in new premium. For the eighth consecutive year, the Trust retained more than 99% of its members. This new growth and member retention is critical to the law of large numbers and to the spread of risk that protects the pool and its members. In 2015, the Trust paid a \$1,000,000 dividend. During this same period, the Trust protected members by paying more than \$16 million in claims.

Trust membership includes: 219 Cities and Towns, 12 Counties, and 296 Special Service Districts. This diversity provides essential spread of risk that benefits members. While we may not be the right fit for everyone, we're the preferred choice of more than 525 members: 88% of Cities and Towns; 72% of Special Districts, and 41% of Counties. Each year the Trust responds to scores of Request for Proposals (RFPs) issued by members and non-members alike. Our responses are carefully scrutinized by dozens of elected officials, executive teams, lawyers, accountants, and other key stakeholders who evaluate coverage, service, and price. This level of scrutiny translates to thousands of eyes evaluating and grading the Trust each year. Still, this open market bid process yields more than 99% member retention — eight years running.

The Trust's success is not accidental but rather the by-product of priorities and discipline: first, to identifying member needs; second, to delivering measurable results; and, finally, to transparency and accountability. Our size and scale benefits members by allowing us to negotiate better coverage and rates. Among other things, our policies now include coverage for: first- and third-party pollution, first- and third-party cyber liability, and limited defense for declaratory and injunctive relief, land use, and malfeasance.
