- 4. Recall the illustration from Richard Sibbs (God's love is like a sun). Discuss this analogy.
- 5. What does Romans 5:8 teach us about God's love? How does this reality impact how we view God's love?
- 6. How is God's love unconditional? How is it sacrificial? How is God's love generous?
- 7. How does God's love transform us?
- 8. What does it mean to be "adopted by God?" [see John 1:11-13]
- 9. What does it mean to "abide in God's love?" [see Jude 21]
- 10. How do you personally respond to the love of God? How are you tempted to disbelieve in God's love? How does the world's conception of love distort a biblical understanding of God's love?
