Overview

Corraborating Texts

1 John 1:8-10; Galatians 6:1; Ecclesiastes 4:9

Discussion Questions

- 1. What does this passage of Scripture mean? [the gospel empowers us to help one another when we fall]
- 2. What is "a sin not leading to death"? [sin that is forgiven through the blood of Jesus] Why is this important? [John is teaching us that: 1. Everyone is sinful. 2. All sins committed by believers are forgiven in Jesus]
- 3. What is the first thing we should be doing when we see other believers heading towards sin? [pray—for conviction, repentance, and restoration] What else can we be doing? [restore with gentleness through building depth in relationships, awareness, and investment]
- 4. How does this text point to the Gospel? [1. in that the gospel shows us that all believers are admitted into the Kingdom and 2. We need one other because we all fall short]
- 5. How should our relationships with one another look in order to be experiencing victory over sin? [we should be honest with one another about our sin, we should be willing to get help from one another, and we should always be seeking truth]
