Discussion Questions

1. How does the Bible talk about God's glory? What aspect of God's glory stands out to you?
2. How is it not selfish of God to seek after His own glory? How do we as individuals rob God of His due glory?
3. How is God's glory displayed in His acts of creating, condemning, saving, and sanctifying?
4. We glorify God through appreciation (admiration), worship (praise), affection (love), subjection (obedience), and proclamation (to testify). Nobody does any of these things perfectly but through Christ's grace and the Spirit we can grow in glorifying God. Is there one of these ways of glorifying God that you want to focus on this week? Why?
5. Reflecting on the Five Solas (Scripture alone, Grace alone, Faith alone, Christ alone, and God's glory alone), Has there been one that has been the most meaningful for you to learn and think more about?
