Discussion Questions

- 1. Does Christ's resurrection seem more real and palpable to you on Easter Sunday? Do you think that God intended this event to be remembered in a special way once a year? Why or why not?
- 2. When have you last "blessed God" by sincerely engaging in thanksgiving and being moved to testify about Him? What does scripture have to say about stoking this response?
- 3. Pastor Joe pointed out that mercy—or lovingkindness—is an essential part of who God is. Discuss what scripture says about it (see 2 Corinthians 1:3, Psalm 103:13, 1 Petet 1:3) and how you understand it.
- 4. How is being born again more than just a "fresh start?" [we are actually recreated by God of an imperishable seed with Christ's imputed righteousness—much more than even the initial state of Adam and Evel
- 5. Do you regularly look to Jesus' resurrection as not just a historical fact, but also a present reality wherein the Spirit is actively regenerating, indwelling, sanctifying and guaranteeing resurrection for those who believe?
