- 3. Scripture is clear that life is hard for everyone (although in different degrees and at different times). How does this perspective challenge your own expectations of life?
- 4. Instead of believing that bad things "just happen" to us, we are encouraged to see that we are called to a hard life. How can realizing God's calling on your life impact how you respond in hard times?
- 5. How does Christ's love bring you comfort in hard times?
- 6. How do you comfort others in hard times?
- 7. Paul prays for hearts to be changed instead of circumstances to be changed. How is God working on your heart through your current circumstances?
