Discussion Questions

- 1. What has a tendency to discourage you in your relationship with Christ?
- 2. How are you applying God's forgiveness of your sins to your discouragement? (See also Psalm 119:41–48 and 1 John 5:1–5)
- 3. What is the link between forgiveness and obedience? [we obey because we belong to God through Jesus]
- 4. How does the fact that—as believers—we are forgiven tie into your fellowship with God?
- 5. What sins seem to be winning your life? What are you doing to overcome them?
- 6. Define sanctification.
- 7. What three parts of sanctification were mentioned in the sermon? [positional: our standing before God based on Christ's work / progressive: being made more and more like Christ (see also Psalm 119:1–2, 1 Peter 5:8, and James 5:16) / possessive: we will be free of sin (see also Philippians 1:6 and John 14:1–3)] Why are these categories important? How do we see them in the sermon's passage? How do we see them in our daily lives?
