Take up Your Cross

Scripture: Luke 9:23-27

Series: The Gospel of Luke

Overview

Main point: The cross Jesus commands you to take up requires His death and yours.

In this challenging text, Christ states the requirement to be His disciple is to die to yourself daily. In following Christ, we must remember the emptiness in pursing an easy life and that it is only through dying to self that we are able to take up our new abundant life in Christ—all the while holding to Christ's own sacrificial death on a cross that cleanses us and allows the Holy Spirit to empower us.

- 4. How have you found verse 24 to be true?
- 5. How can you better take up your cross daily in the coming days?
- 6. Which of the applications (confession, spending time in God's Word, and looking to Christ) feels the most challenging and why?
