Overview

Expectations can lead us astray. We all struggle with misguided and unrealistic expectations. - 2. What happens when our expectations are not met (either by others, or by God)? What are some biblical examples of unmet expectations and results? [discuss Israel's expectations for their savior specifically]
- 3. What is our reaction to the unexpected? What external factors can play into this? What implications does this have when it comes to our faith in a sovereign God?
- 4. What are some of the types of favor that Jim mentioned on Sunday? [initiative; calling; salvation; assurance; obedience] Are there any of these that seem particularly hard to believe are indeed favor? What gospel truths can we tell ourselves to remind ourselves that these things truly are favor? What gospel truths can we use to encourage one another when the unexpected happens?
