Overview

- 5. What does it mean that Jesus "prays perfectly in our place?" How does knowing this truth motivate us to pray?
- 6. Read John 17. For what does Jesus pray in this passage? [that God would keep us, filled with joy, sanctified, see the glory of Christ] How should this shape the aim and content of our prayers?
- 7. Joe listed ten words of advice that can help cultivate a strong prayer life. What habits have helped your prayer life? What are some habits you want to start incorporating?
