Overview

All believers struggle with doubt in some measure in various seasons. Because of our imperfection and sin, we doubt **the existence of God**, **the Word of God**, **the character of God**, and **the Gospel of God**. Luke writes his gospel to *all* of us, so that we would be assured of the things we have been taught. Faith grows by the grace of God through the Word of God.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Why do Christians struggle with doubt? Not just doubting itself—but struggle with even admitting their doubt?
- 2. How does imperfect faith and the presence of sin impact the believer's faith?
- 3. Pastor Joe shared four areas that Christians could doubt (God's existence, God's word, God's character, and God's Gospel). In which area or areas do you find yourself doubting?
- 4. When seasons of doubt spring up, where do we typically turn to find answers? Where should we be going? [the Word of God and the people of God]
- 5. What must you do during these times of doubt? [a. be honest—confess your doubt; b. seek to know God in Scripture; c. be patient; d. learn to doubt *yourself* instead of doubting Scripture] Which of these do you most often neglect? How does community help us as we sort through our doubt?
