Overview

Discussion Questions

1. The main idea of this sermon was: “A small faith in a great Savior is better than a great faith in a small Savior.” Which half of this statement best describes you and why? What can you change or continue to do in order to grow?
2. Why are the facts of the gospel (Jesus being sent by God, dying for sinners, and being raised by the Spirit) important? How do these truths currently impact your life? Are they doing so daily?
3. According to this passage, what is our biggest problem? [we are sinners] According to this passage, how do we deal with it? [through the blood of Jesus] Do we believe this? What do we do now? [repent and believe]
4. As you evaluate your faith, is it growing? If so, how? If not, what can be done about it?
