Overview

 - How did Joseph <u>respond</u> to the angel?
 - What was the significance of Joseph's adoption of Jesus prophetically?

2. Discuss our situation:

- · We have many problems. What is our root-cause problem?
- How significant is our problem? How powerful are our enemies?
- How does the coming of Jesus (birth, life, death, resurrection) provide the <u>solution</u> to our problems and defeat our enemies?
- How should we <u>respond</u> to God's mercy to us in Jesus?
- 3. How can we help and encourage one another truly celebrate Christmas? How do we redeem the holiday within our family and corporate celebrations?
