Overview

The topic of sin is a heavy one. Most people—most believers, even—don't take it seriously enough. What is sin, what makes it so bad, and what can be done about it?

Discussion Questions

- 1. What was the main idea of this sermon? [your sin is far more destructive than you know and Jesus is far more necessary than than you imagine] How does this idea affect the way you see sin in general? What about your sin in particular?
- 2. Keeping in mind the main idea, what is sin? [doing what God forbids or refusing to do something He commands]
- 3. If you are going to commit sins of *commission* (doing what God has told us not to), what do those look like?
- 4. If you are going to commit sins of *omission* (not doing what God has told us to do), what do those look like?
- 5. In what ways do you see your sin working against your humanity?
- 6. In what ways do you see your sin working against your relationships?
- 7. If sin is denying God and declaring war against Him, how specifically does your sin do that?
- 8. What is the only way to deal with your sin? [repent] What prevents you from doing that? What does that look like? [recognizing our sin, owning it, being broken by it, and confessing it] What is the promise if we do? [finding rest and peace]
- 9. What is the application of this sermon? [know, believe, and repent]
