## **Discussion Questions**

- 1. Describe your personal prayer life. Are you consistent with this discipline? Are you bold in your prayers? What helps your prayer life and what hinders it?
- 2. How do you respond when God doesn't answer your prayer—or doesn't in the way you want Him to? Do you trust Him or do you become bitter?
- 3. What does God expect? [belief in Jesus exclusively and love of others sacrificially] If that's what God expects, how are you doing?
- 4. What gets in the way of us doing what God expects? [unbelief and pride) Describe your struggles in these areas.
- 5. If we know and understand what God expects, how does that apply to evangelism?
- Do you struggle with assurance? How can we know we have it? (Observable faith, the way we live. If we don't believe and love others we shouldn't be experiencing assurance; but if so we can be assured.)
