1.1 - Name

1. The society's full name is "Queensland University of Technology Electrical Engineering Student Society", or abbreviated to QUT EESS or EESS.

1.2 - Affiliation

QUT EESS may only be affiliated with associations, clubs or businesses that directly benefits QUT EESS. No affiliation should benefit any member more than the EESS.

By-law 1 stipulates the conditions of EESS Affiliations.

1.3 - Constitution Modification

Editing and/or modifying the constitution can only take place at an AGM and where at least 10% of the club's current members agree to the proposed constitution changes.

1.4 - Common Goals

QUT EESS's common goals are to establish a community between Electrical-related Engineering students and QUT as a whole. We aim to help develop events that benefit students, both in a career and social sense. Creating stronger relationships between students, academic staff and the wider community will help make QUT a better place for all involved.

2.1 - Executive Positions

The executive board is comprised of at least the following roles:

- President
- Vice President
- Treasurer
- Secretary

More roles may be added as per by law 2.1

2.3 - Nominations for Executive Roles

2.4 - Responsibilities

It is expected that all executives:

- Contribute ideas to the development of the society
- Notify other executives as soon as possible if they will not be able to attend meetings or complete a task by a set deadline.

Other responsibilities for executives are outlined in by-law 2.2.

3.1 - Basic Membership

Membership for QUT EESS is available to all students, QUT wide. To become an official member, the applicant must:

1. Provide personal details including: name, email address, contact number and student number.
2. Pay the current membership fee.

At any time, if deemed necessary by the executive board, a membership application and/or current membership can be declined/cancelled at any time, for any reason.

3.2 - Member Rules & Regulations

Becoming a QUT EESS paid member requires the applicant to:

1. Present their membership card at events that require member only access.
2. Contact QUT EESS executives if any issues arise regarding their membership.

4.1 - Potential Obstacles

Potential obstacles that could arise include but not limited to:

- Personal commitments outside university (family, part time jobs)
- Personal commitments within university (Assignments, other extracurricular activities)
- Language barriers with students
- Financial restraints - both personal and within QUT EESS
- Policy restricting some of the activities we wish to undertake

There is also a high likelihood that unexpected issues will turn up without warning, mainly due to most members having a vastly different background, and therefore different personal problems.

If one or more of these issues present problem(s), the consequences outlined in By-law 2.3 will be carried out unless By-law 2.4 is invoked.
