




Stamford's FLA Gallery opens exhibition of new artists

A downtown Stamford gallery is expanding its roster with an exhibition of new contemporary artists.

The Fernando Luis Alvarez Gallery opens "New Artists, New Perspectives" — featuring the work of Carole Feuerman, Mark Venice and Tana Wolski-Kazakowitz — with a public reception on Friday, May 18, 6-9 p.m.

This show "will highlight a new level of artists, reflected both in price of the work and in the stage of their careers," Fernando Luis Alvarez, FLA owner and artist, said. "For the gallery, this challenges us to truly develop and hone our model in promoting the career development of the artists."

Feuerman is an established contemporary sculptor with an international following. Her hyper-realist pieces were recently displayed in Petrosino Square by the NYC Parks and Recreation Department.

Venice, an Australian mixed media and textile artist who has reemerged from a fine art career hiatus specifically for this show, has pieces in public and private collections throughout the world, including casinos owned by the renowned collector and developer Steven Wynn.

Wolski-Kazakowitz is a young Russian-Polish painter and self-taught artist who has works in the permanent collection of the New Britain Museum of American Art.
