enjoy God's amazing creation! I always look to summer as time for a camping trip and for swimming. But, even if I'm working, sandals and shorts give me a change of pace.

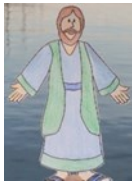

Episcopalooza

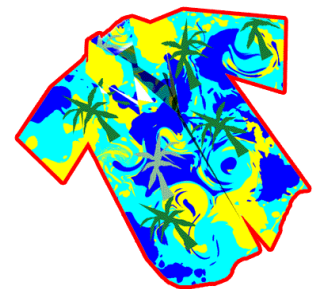
