As the Spring season seems to finally have sprung, we find ourselves preparing to get things ready for the end of a very successful school year! We recently celebrated the confirmation of our eighth graders and First Holy Communion of our second grade students. At the end of April we also celebrated a very special week for the Early Childhood students. We celebrated the Week of the Young Child. This week, sponsored by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), is celebrated nationwide as a spotlight on the important role of Early Childhood Education. Here at St. Ben's we are blessed with a large population of three, four, five and six year old students. We currently have over 315 students enrolled in Preschool and Kindergarten! The purpose of the Week of the Young Child is to focus attention on the needs of young children and their families and celebrate such programs. It is a time to recognize that early childhood years lay the foundation for children's success in school and later in their lives. During this week we took time to celebrate our students, teachers and families through many fun events.

The theme of the Week of the Young Child was Early Years are Learning Years. Each day the Early Childhood program focused on a subtheme of the week to help to celebrate the many aspects of the early learning years. We chose to focus on themes such as Play: Where Learning Begins, Teaching and Teachers Matter, Encouraging Health and Fitness, and Strengthening Families. The Preschool classes each took a field trip to the Wagner Farm where they learned all about life on a farm. The Kindergarteners took a field trip to the Fire Station to get a firsthand look at how firefighters do their jobs!

Throughout the week, each of the classes chose one of the Early Childhood teachers to celebrate by making banners and cards and showing their appreciation. We are very fortunate to have 18 wonderful Early Childhood teachers. The students shared in open gym time with a partner class. Benny the Bengal, our school mascot, made a visit to each classroom to celebrate our St. Ben's spirit!

For our focus on families and literacy, parents helped to create a class book by sharing the reasons their child is special. The students were encouraged to bring their family's favorite story to share with their friends. We also welcomed all of St. Benedict Prep's administrators, Ms. Gemo, Ms. Mickelburgh, Mrs. Feely, Mr. Accardi and Mr. Potempa, to be guest readers. The students loved to hear their favorite stories, as well! Overall, the week was

quite a success. It is wonderful to have the support of the St. Ben's community in getting out the message of the importance of Early Childhood Education and we look forward to many more years of educating young children in our community.




