About the Scholarship

The Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Fund was started in 1985 by a small group of neighbors in the Mount Baker community and is a sponsored activity of the Mount Baker Community Club. This year, the Fund will award at least 10 scholarships in the amount of \$3,000 or \$5,000 to local high school seniors who plan to attend 2-year or 4-year accredited colleges or universities. Qualified recipients will receive the scholarship for a second year. The goal of this scholarship is to help deserving students achieve the dream of a higher education. We select candidates on the basis of evidence of financial need, overcoming adversity, academic progress, community service and desire to continue their education. We consider students who might be overlooked by other, more traditional scholarships. Students from ethnic or racial groups historically underrepresented in higher education are highly encouraged to apply.

Eligibility

- 1. Students must meet the following criteria:
- Be a resident of or attend school in one of the following zip codes: 98104, 98108, 98118, 98122, 98134, 98144;
- Be a member of a racial or ethnic group that is underrepresented in higher education;
- Demonstrate financial need; and
- φ Complete and submit the attached Application Form along with the required supporting documents.
- 2. The application must be e-mailed, hand delivered, or postmarked no later than Friday, January 20, 2017. We will not consider incomplete or late submissions.

All applications and information provided will be kept confidential and will be reviewed only by the Scholarship Committee and its designees. Scholarship recipients will be notified by email or telephone. Scholarships will be awarded at a ceremony at the Mount Baker Community Club on March 24, 2017. Attendance is mandatory.
