Women’s Transportation Seminar (WTS) Boston Public Art Committee held a launch gala on September 7 to celebrate the new public art that will be installed in South Station and to raise support for it.

Speakers at the event included WTS-Boston Public Art Co-Chairs Lisa Brother and Hyun-A Park, special guest Paul Ha who directs the MIT List Visual Arts Center, and WTS-Boston President Rebecca Williamson.

Ellen Harvey—the internationally renowned artist selected to design the artwork—unveiled her concept, which wraps the space with conceptual map of the greater Boston area and incorporates a sea blue color representing the waterways surrounding us. The dynamic new piece will have a major impact on the space, delighting the thousands of people walking through the South Station area daily.
