


Autumn One

Transition unit - Burglar Bill (one week)




Who's that creeping down the street? Who's that climbing up the wall? Who's that coming through the window? Who's that? ... It's Burglar Bill.

Report writing - *Dinosaurology* (two weeks)




In this long-lost expedition journal, readers are introduced to a wealth of living, breathing dinosaurs, as our intrepid explorers study them in their natural habitat.


Persuasion unit – *The Lorax* (two weeks)

Creating images poetry unit – *Last Night I Saw the City Breathing* (one week)


Last night, I saw the City sleeping, Roads Night-dreamed, Street

Recounts unit – *Tuesday* (two weeks)





Princess Blankets



Poetic style unit – Bad, Bad Cats (two weeks)




