1.) Place consistent and intensive pressure upon the UAF Title IX Coordinators on behalf of the complainant.
2.) Work out legislation that allows for the complainant and defendant to be separated in all aspects on campus (i.e. housing, schooling, and transportation).
A protest, involvement on campus in displaying their protests against the actions of the administration, an investigative committee, hosting public discussions with students and the administration. Hosting public talks around campus to get the conversation on the topic and address the issues.
Acknowledgement of the misbehavior is important, possibly do a public meeting/ forum to discuss with the students as a group what happened and where we should go from here.
Actively express student displeasure with how Title IX is being handled by the university.
Actually defend victims of sexual assault! Don't be a corrupt evil organization that cares more about a statistic and money than its students.
Actually doing something to protect both sides of the case instead of acting in the interest of the accused. Believing people when they say they have been raped no matter their gender.

Do not try this case in the court of public opinion, let the organizations including court system determine guilt or innocence.
Do what they do
Educate students about the actions those who have been affected by the allegations would like to see.
Expel offenders
Explain to the students why a person is innocent until proven guilty or found responsible. That the university cannot take actions that destroys a students educational career due to an unproven accusation. EVERY party in an accusation case deserves a fair and proper investigation & that takes time.
Follow through with discipline...
Freedom of speech for those who were involved in the incident.
Give prompt timelines and make them publicly accessible. Be transparent in how the process works and when people can expect responses. In cases of violent crime, have procedures in place to separate people - even if taking the same class. If people do not respond (UAF), hold them accountable.
Green Dot Courses for everyone
Hold them accountable. Push for firings and for increased transparency.
Hold them more responsible, instead of raising tuition make them look at their spending and cut that.
I beleve that there could be open forums held and anounced to students possably through KSUA or e-mail a notice so that it is less of an ordeal for students to get involved.

I do not have enough information to evaluate this.

I haven't been following closely, so I am unsure of what is fact and what is not. I hope that the university will act honestly, will protect the rights of students, and will dismiss students who do not uphold the law or basic human morals.
I think ASUAF should be the one making sure the university does its job
I think that one thing is to have suspects move dorms until some sort of due process can be performed.
I think the most important aspect of handling cases involving sexual misconduct is keeping the students involved in the case informed as to what decisions are being made and WHY. The biggest issue I have seen has been a lack of trust by students involved in cases, in the system itself.
I think the University is doing fine and I don't understand the people who are saying the campus is unsafe.
I think we should take a more thorough look at the evidence and decide how the university was at fault.
I want them to be actively supportive fro victims of sexual assault and domestic violence. The university doesn't hold such situation well.
I would like situations in which the alleged perpetrator of a sexual assault crime is moved back into the same dorm frequented by or lived in by the alleged victim without their knowledge to end. At the very least the victim should -AT LEAST- be informed that the perpetrator still lives near them.
I would like to see action taken, but I would also like situations to be investigated fully to make sure victims are making a true claim (while not meaning the person isn't being believed) but rather verified.
I would like to see more action against misconduct.
I would like to see more action regarding students who are either implicated or charged with sexual assualt and/or rape rather than the relatively minor punishments some students have faced in regards to these accusations.
I would love for ASUAF to find out if we can get another person that can look over the cases, because I heard that part of the problem was because she was the only one.
Or maybe an ASUAF student rep that checks in... If that's a thing that can happen.
If they have proved and found a student to have raped another student, they should face expulsion. Also the victims of rape need to be better informed of the proceedings and taken care of. Any allegations of rape should also be informed to the police as well as campus security.
inform the student body of the conflict on hand and what action the university is taking.

Initiate procedure for protecting both the victim and accused during investigation. Procedure is described during student initiation and dorm check-in. Encourage the university to incorporate local police in the investigation to avoid potential conflict of interest with university investigations.
Inquire about staffing in the Title IX office and addressing resources for students so that cases can be handled in a timely and fair manner that is nondiscriminatory to both or all parties.
Instead of ignoring what happened, ignore the fact alcohol was involved for BOTH parties. Looking at the facts, and quit ignoring people on campus who have spoken on how they feel. WE FEEL IGNORED.
