

As many of you already know, back in the fall there was a frightening accident that resulted in the loss of Antioch College's beloved little gray house next to The Riding Centre. Luckily, no one was hurt. At this time, Antioch College has no plans to rebuild.

This house had been part of The Riding Centre since it came to be in 1959. Some of you may remember Mr. Graham, who lived there before then, but I have always known it as Louise's house. There, our founder, Louise Soelberg, lived until her death in 1994. It is where many students spent hours making wonderful memories, and I was lucky enough to be one of those students.

There were Christmas mornings with Louise, when everyone, no matter what age, was served eggnog with a little sherry. There were dinners of delicious macaroni and cheese at Louise's table. There were the Pepperidge Farm Chessmen cookies that she so readily shared in her living room. There were the wild games of Parcheesi that went into the night (Louise would send you "home" in a heartbeat!). There were the sightings of a young girl ghost in the house, even recently, that has kept us all excitedly wondering who she is. But we know why she loved that house. Because we all did, too.

My last memory of that wonderful house is the late morning of Friday, Octo-

ber 23, 2015. Honey Pepper, school horse extraordinaire, was in the barnyard with a young rider on her back when the house, which Antioch College had just newly refurbished, blew off its foundation! Honey Pepper barely flinched. The term "bomb proof" is commonly used in the horse world to describe a horse that is calm and steady and can handle almost anything. Many people describe their horses that way, but few actually get to prove it like our Honey Pepper did that day.

There is an open space where the little gray house once stood. Those of us who remember it as Louise's house will always have our special memories. But, if you look out from where the house once stood, you can now see our beautiful pastures . . . the view Louise got to see every day while she lived in that house. That makes me happy.
