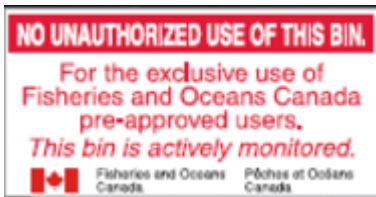
When: September 11th – 15th (Okeover will be Sept 15th – 20th)

Whom: Done through an initiative between DFO and BC shellfish farmers

Shellfish Growers, mark your calendars, start collecting debris from your tenures and start making piles and get rid some of that debris!

There has never been a better time because during these dates, you won't pay any hauling or tipping fees!
