### **Permanent Booking Sheets**





# GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

## Course and Clubhouse

After a very long and quiet winter, it is nice to see the sun shining and golfers out on the course. There have been a few cosmetic changes there recently, in particular the removal/pruning of some of our larger trees. After another sizable limb had fallen from "Top's Tree" on the 9<sup>th</sup> hole, the club went through the correct channels and sought advice from the Native Vegetation Council regarding the correct treatment of the tree. To preserve as much of the tree as possible, we were advised to removed up to 70% of the heavy foliage. This should prevent any further limbs from falling and help retain Top's Tree for more years to come. The troublesome tree on the left hand side of the 11<sup>th</sup> hole was removed because of the likely danger to the powerlines in the event of a storm.

Members will notice the beginnings of a balustrade being erected around the raised cement walkway around the clubhouse. After having someone fall off the edge after a function last year, our Insurance company advised that some form of safety railing would be ideal to protect against potential claims in future. Thank you to John Gilbert for his work in sourcing materials and the installation of the balustrade.

## Volunteer Program

Once again, a huge thank you to those who have put their hand up to volunteer around the club over the year. As usual, we had a fantastic turnout to help the ground staff during the coring program in mid-October. We also had a dozen burly men help clear the debris from the 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> trees as mentioned above. As a thank you to our volunteers, we will be having our yearly Volunteers BBQ on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> December. Keep an eye on your inbox/letterbox for your invitation. During the BBQ our Volunteer Coordinator, Phil Kersten, will address the group and inform them of upcoming projects.

## Bar Operations

As of 1<sup>st</sup> December, there will be some changes to the bar operating hours from Monday to Wednesday. As these days are covered by the office staff, the bar hours will reflect the office open hours. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, last drinks will be called at 5pm with the clubhouse being locked shortly thereafter.

## **Dress Code**

In recent weeks I have received an increasing number of questions and complaints in regard to the standards of dress on course by our members. As stated in your members handbook:

- **Shirts must have a collar or polo style neck**
- **No large advertising logos are permitted**
- **Small logos compatible with the image of golf are acceptable**
- **Jeans and "smart" long shorts are acceptable provided they are neat, clean and not garnished**
- **Tailored shorts are permitted**
- **Track suits and track pants are not permitted**
- **Football style or excessively short shorts are not permitted.**

## SOME HELP FROM MIKE

Mike and I are now playing the 17<sup>th</sup> hole where I find that the position of the nearest point of relief isn't always obvious. I am right handed.

*My first shot ends up on the cart path just before the beginning of the fairway. I walk up to it.*

*Richard* As my ball is on the path I can take a drop can't I Mike?

*Mike* Yes that's right.

*I notice that the ball is pretty near the centre of the path but slightly to the right.*

*Richard* I will drop it on the right side here.

*Mike* No Richard. In this instance the right side is not the nearest point of relief.

*Richard* Why not? The ball is nearer the grass on the right side of the pathway than the left.

*Mike* That is true but you also have to take the distance of your stance into consideration. When you play the shot after your drop you must not have your feet on the pathway. You are right handed. To see what I mean go and stand on the right of the path with your club positioned as if you are ready to play the shot.

*Richard* OK.

*I leave the ball where it is and stand on the right with my feet just off the path. I take up my stance as if I was about to take a shot from there.*

*Mike* You see where the head of your club is. That is the nearest point of relief if you drop on the right. Your dropping zone is within one club length from that position, i.e. even further to the right from the path where the ball is.

*Richard* Yes it is a fair way away from my ball.

*Mike* Now go and take up your stance on the left side with your club head just off the path.

*Still leaving the ball where it is I stand as Mike as suggested.*

*Mike* You see where your club head is. That is the nearest point of relief if you drop on the left. Your dropping zone is within one club length from that position, i.e. further to the left from the path where the ball is..

*Richard* Yes I see what you mean. So in this case although my ball is nearer the right side of the path, my nearest point of relief is on the left side of the path.

*Mike* Yes that's correct. The nearest point of relief is the distance between the ball (on the path where you hit it) and your club

head position, according to whether you take up your stance on the left or right.

*Richard* Wow!

*So I take the ball and drop it on the left within one club length of the path.*

*Richard* Hurrah! Success at last! So the basic rule seems to be that my drop zone on the left is one club length from the edge of the path, and my drop zone on the right is one club length beyond my stance width when I stand off the path. Then I look to see which zone is nearest the ball on the path.

*Mike* That is the way to look at it.

*We then play out the rest of the hole with no further queries!*
