Port of Greater Baton Rouge Commission Elects 2017-18 Officers

BATON ROUGE, LA – The board of commissioners for the Port of Greater Baton Rouge, at its regular meeting held on November 16, 2017, elected officers for 2017-2018. Officers elected include Angela Machen, PhD, East Baton Rouge Parish, as president; Kevin Stevens, East Baton Rouge Parish, vice-president; and Clint Seneca, Iberville Parish, treasurer.

Angela Machen, PhD, president, is a principal in Machen Management Group. She has worked in the field of environmental health research and management at Tulane Health Sciences Center, The Center for Evidence Based Global Health, LSU, and SRC.

Kevin Stevens, vice-president, is co-owner of Blanchard's Building Materials in Plaquemine, as well as co-owner of State Lumber and Hardware located on Highland Road in Baton Rouge.

Clint Seneca, treasurer, is a deputy assessor for the Iberville Parish Assessor's Office, and is an elected Alderman for the Town of Grosse Tete.

The port governance body is a 15-member commission appointed by Governor John Bel Edwards to establish policy and provide oversight into the port's development. Port commissioners are selected from the four parishes served by the port: Ascension, Iberville, East and West Baton Rouge. The Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission oversees 85 miles of the Mississippi River and a port that handles millions of tons of cargo annually while providing access to mid-America through the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway and the upper Mississippi River system.
