THE BEST-LAID PLANS OF MICE AND MEN

Human beings are always making plans for the future, and in general that is good. But the "dark side" of planning is that we do so to try to gain peace and comfort for ourselves as we move into the future. The larger question about the future is: Who do you trust in to guide you and bring you into a future that is good and bright? As most Americans have learned to be "self-reliant" they trust in themselves to figure out a successful future. One of the most successful generals in our nation was General George S. Patton, a brilliant strategist in mechanized warfare (i.e. tank warfare). Patten made detailed battle plans with literally hundreds of "contingency plans." When he was once asked how all that planning worked out, Patton responded, "Well, it all goes to heck as soon as the first shot is fired." So what was the real secret to his success in battle? He always demanded to have a reliable chaplain who "knew how to pray for victory." (By the way, Patton went through a long list of wishy-washy chaplains who were afraid to be specific enough to boldly ask for victory).

In the Old Testament King Solomon was a very successful ruler. In Proverbs 3:5 he says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding." Of course we should go to wise counselors, remembering that true wisdom comes only from God and His Word. And so King Solomon says in Proverbs, "Without counsel plans go wrong, but with many advisors they succeed" (Proverbs 15:22). But the key to the future is ultimately faith in God. As King David once declared to God, "...Your hand shall lead me, and Your right hand shall hold me" (Psalm 139:10). Jesus, our Good Shepherd, assures us in John 10:27-28, "My sheep hear My voice and I know them, and they follow Me; and I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of My hand."

This peaceful trust in God's almighty and gracious care for us is so well expressed in the hymn *On Eagles'* Wings (Lutheran Service Book 727). The beautiful refrain of that hymn declares:

And He will raise you up on eagles' wings Bear you on the breath of dawn, Make you to shine like the sun, And hold you in the palm of His hand. The Lord God who cares for us at all times is the great "I AM" (cf. Exodus 3:14). He is the beginning, the present, and the completion of our life. The totality of history is already complete in Him. The Triune God declares to us: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, says the lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty" (Revelation 1:8). He proclaims this at the beginning of the book of Revelation and then again at the end, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end" (Revelation 21:6). So, why be afraid of the future? Our gracious and merciful Lord God is in charge of all the days of our lives.

As we begin the month of June and enter the season of summer, we will celebrate the great festival of the Holy Trinity (June 7th). The trinitarian nature of the true God is a further assurance of a blessed future. The beginning of all things comes from God the Father, who proclaims the eternal Word of creation, and whose Spirit lovingly hovers over all things like a mother hen spreading her wings over her little chicks (Genesis 1:1-3). So, our best plan for the future is to keep studying God's Word, which alone reveals God's good and gracious will for us. Then, by faith, we should strive to order our lives according to His will. It is as St. Paul says: "We know that in all things God works for good for those who love Him, who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28).

Therefore we can go ahead and make our "little plans" for the summer, trusting in God to take care of all the "big things." And we pray the simple prayer of the ancient Church: "Help. save, comfort, and defend us, gracious Lord. Amen."

THANK YOU, PASTOR BLAIN! Pastor Blain has informed the Board of Elders and the Church Council that he will be stepping down from his responsibilities as Messiah's Vacancy Pastor (administration, education and spiritual care) as of **Monday, June 8th**. He will continue to lead worship services until **Sunday, July 19th**.

We thank Pastor Blain for the 17 months he has served as our shepherd, and wish him and Linda God's continued blessings. If you would like to thank Pastor Blain personally, please request his contact information from the church office.

Rick Krueger and the Board of Elders are working with our Circuit Visitor (Rev. Jason Peterson of St. Peter-Rockford) and the Michigan District-LCMS to recruit a vacancy pastor for the duration of our pastoral call process. Please keep them in your prayers as they do so!

UPDATE ON IN-PERSON ACTIVITIES: At their April 27th meeting, Messiah's Board of Elders suspended inperson activities indefinitely, choosing to monitor the situation and revisiting their decision as the circumstances warrant it. The Elders' goal is to safely re-open in-person activities as soon as possible.

In light of the state of Michigan beginning a phased, regional re-opening process, the Church Council and Board of Elders have drafted *Guidelines for Reintroduction of In-Person Worship and Education*; we've enclosed a copy of them with this newsletter. These *Guidelines* are a working draft, subject to change as the situation develops and meant to guide our operations once in-person activities resume.

Guidelines for Reintroduction of In-Person Worship and Education Updated 5/18/20

Please note: This is a working draft, subject to change as the situation continues to develop. If you have suggestions or concerns about any of these guidelines, please address them to your family's elder.

This document is intended to guide Messiah's operations during the initial period after in-person activities have resumed. The focus is more on the "how" than on the "when."

What additional worship opportunities will be offered?

- Worship service video will continue to be livestreamed and archived on YouTube.
- Worship service audio will continue to be recorded and uploaded to messiahgr.org.
- The Board of Elders will continue to explore alternative delivery methods.

What general CDC guidelines apply to us at Messiah?

- Stay home when you are sick or have underlying medical conditions.
 - o Take your temperature and verify that it is below 100.4°F.
- Maintain minimum 6-foot social distancing and avoid people who are sick.
- Avoid unnecessary touching of surfaces, handrails, and doors.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze. Discard soiled tissues at home.
- Wearing of face coverings is encouraged.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water.

How will we maintain 6-foot distancing between family units?

- The Fellowship Hall will be open as an overflow space with a livestream of the service, as needed to maintain distancing.
- We will sit on both sides of sanctuary, every third pew.
- Within a pew, family units will space themselves 6 feet apart (approximately 3 people) from other family units.
- Adult Bible Class will be held in the fellowship hall; remote access options will continue to be explored.
- Smaller Bible studies and children's educational activities can be held in larger, well-ventilated areas of the church, or held outdoors as weather permits.

How will we minimize cross-contamination?

- Friendship pads, hymnals, etc. will be removed from pews.
- Offering plates will not be passed. Offerings can be given electronically or will be taken at the sanctuary door. *Note: We will need to develop an offerings protocol for collecting, bagging, and depositing in the safe.*
- The entire service will be printed in the bulletin. Congregants should take bulletins with them for reference, then recycle or discard at home.
- Volunteers will attend the outside door for entry and exit. Inner doors will be left open.
- No handshakes or hugs. Pastor will greet those who wish to chat in the front of the sanctuary.
- No food served after worship for now; kitchen remains closed.

- Restrooms will remain open. Water fountains will remain out of service.
- The nursery will be closed.

What sanitation practices will we follow?

- The sanctuary will be sanitized between services.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be provided.
- Protocols for safe distribution and reception of Holy Communion will be developed by the Board of Elders in consultation with the Altar Guild.

When will in-person activities resume?

- In-person worship and educational activities will be considered:
 - When large gatherings are allowed to resume (viz. MI Safe Start stage 5*)
 - When the Board of Elders determines that adequate volunteers are available to perform necessary supporting tasks (e.g. elders, ushers, altar guild)
- When these activities resume, the Board of Elders will determine the service schedule.
