Perhaps as the new year begins, you have felt a sense of relief that the frenzied activity of the holidays is over. Leftover Thanksgiving turkey is nothing but a memory. Christmas celebrations are done and the gifts have been put to their intended use. You've finally recovered from that late night on New Years. A year that will always be remembered in infamy has come to an end, and although routines aren't "normal" again yet, they are at least more routine than they were at about any time in the past 10 months.

So also, in church, it can be easy to see January as the beginning of a sort of intermission between Christmas and Lent/Easter. The torrent of services in the Christmas season having passed, it can be easy to leave that Bethlehem baby in the manger of our minds until Lent awakens us to a grown man marching toward Calvary.

While we might simply think of it as the dead of winter, the church year calls this season Epiphany. Having celebrated Jesus birth during Christmas, the church's calendar continues to follow the life of Jesus, ending in His death and resurrection during Holy Week. In the time between, we remember the events of His life by which he showed His followers His Messianic Identity as their God-made-flesh savior.

His Baptism by John in the Jordan River reveals the Triune God, as the voice of the Father and the Spirit's dove descend over the anointed Son. Miracles and signs mark this portion of the church's time as Jesus showed His role as creator of all things. Finally three disciples will witness a glimpse of Jesus' divine glory as during His conversation with the prophets of old, Moses and Elijah, the Father's voice comes again from Heaven to announce His Son on the Mount of Transfiguration. These are literal "Epiphanies" of God, that is revelations of Jesus Christ as the One True God.

Through the events of His earthly life, Jesus showed the world that He was indeed God Himself, and in His church, he is continually revealed to believers in His Word, Body, and Blood. May God bless you, not during an intermission between holidays, but as you remember once again the revelation of Christ to the world this Epiphany.

Messiah Updates for January

2021 CALENDARS: please pick up a complimentary 2021 wall calendar provided by Reyers North Valley Chapel.

GENERAL UPDATE: due to the recent extension of the state of Michigan's emergency epidemic order, Messiah's building will continue to be closed through **Friday**, **January 15**th for all activities except worship services, preschool and essential functions that must be done onsite:

- In-person worship has resumed; see below for further details.
- Preschool will resume classes the week of Monday, January 4th.
- The restart of Sunday School and LifeLight classes has been postponed. We hope to resume classes the week of Sunday, January 17th. (Watch for online Adult Bible Studies as well, resuming on Sunday, January 10th.)
- Board and committee meetings will be held remotely.
- Staff and volunteers will only be onsite for basic operations (worship preparations and services, preschool sessions and preparations, financial work and recordkeeping, drop-offs for volunteer efforts, trustee projects, etc.) To contact staff members, please continue to call the church office; the phone will be answered remotely.

Thanks for your patience and ongoing support throughout an especially challenging time!

WORSHIP UPDATE: We are grateful that, following a time when we only offered livestreams in November and December, we were able to resume in-person for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Worship services on Sundays have also resumed, with two identical services at 8:30 and 11 am each week (each Sunday's 11 am service will also be livestreamed at www. tinyurl.com/messiahgryoutube).

The following precautions are currently in place for in-person worship:

- Please exercise personal discernment when it comes to your health. If you are feeling sick,
 waiting for COVID-19 test results, in recommended quarantine or isolation from COVID-19
 exposure, in a high-risk category, or not comfortable or ready to attend in person, please stay
 home. You will be welcomed in person at the sanctuary door as you enter. All inner doors will
 be kept open.
- To minimize potential spread of COVID-19 in this public setting, wearing of face coverings (fabric masks) is <u>required</u> at all services, from when you enter the building to when you leave. If you forget a face mask or don't have one, please don't let this keep you from attending; we will gladly provide you with one.
- To assure social distancing during worship, advance RSVPs are <u>required</u> for all services. You can sign up by calling the church office, emailing <u>goodlans@messiahgr.org</u> or RSVPing at www.messiahgr.org/events. 26 spots for families or individuals are available in the nave of the sanctuary for each service.
- Worshipers will sit on the opposite ends of alternate pews. Designated seating will be clearly
 marked for "8:30 (1st service)" or "11:00 (2nd service)"; other pew entrances will be roped off
 to assure social distancing.
- After the first service of each two-service day, worshipers will leave through the side door of the narthex, using the classroom hallway and exiting the building through the exterior doors in the fellowship hall foyer.

- Following announcements, dismissal by families will begin from the back of the church. Please maintain social distancing and, weather permitting, wait until you are outdoors to greet others.
- If you want to receive Holy Communion, but do not feel comfortable attending these services, please call (734-645-4353) or email (revjpeterson@yahoo.com) our vacancy pastor, Rev. Jason Peterson, to make arrangements to receive the Lord's Supper by individual weekday appointment, either at the church, at home, or another location that meets your needs.

General guidelines for sanitation and other current practices (complete service bulletins, simplified giving of offerings, Holy Communion protocols, nursery and kitchen closures, restroom availability, post-service sanitizing) will remain in effect. Please see the full version of our Guidelines available at Messiah's website or Welcome Center for complete details. And feel free to contact Pastor Peterson, Rick Krueger or any elder with your questions! The updated Guidelines are subject to change pending further developments.

PRESCHOOL UPDATE...

We are excited to begin 2021 with 3 new families. This brings our total to 24 students. While this is significantly lower than last year, it is the perfect number to be at while dealing with COVID-19 and trying to remain open. We give God ALL THE GLORY for keeping our staff and students healthy thus far. A few families have needed to quarantine, yet our protocol and extra cleaning have played a roll in keeping us open. As we look ahead, we continue to postpone any "extra" events (VIP day, Father's Night, etc.) as our main goal is to offer families an in-person preschool experience for their child. We cannot be grateful enough for your ongoing kindness to us.

Throughout 2020, I continued to hope and pray that we'd arrive at this point with a full-time shepherd leading us forward. God has a pastor for us – that's His promise – but not yet. I also hoped and prayed that God would have mercy and deliver our world and our country from the COVID-19 pandemic – but that hasn't happened yet, either. Believe me when I say that I share whatever impatience and frustration you may feel on both these counts!

not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29:11 ESV) Even after the fall of Jerusalem, the book of Lamentations pointed to those promises:

'The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end;

they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The LORD is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him." (Lamentations 3:22-24 ESV)

And the apostle Paul, writing to the Christians at Rome, pointed to the ultimate reason we can trust God's promises:

"What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?"

"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:31-35, 37-39 ESV)

As we heard once again in Advent and during the 12 days of Christmas, Jesus Christ has truly come! He died and rose again for us, as we'll hear during the coming Lent and Easter. He comes even now through His Word and Sacraments, as we are reminded every time we worship. And He is coming again to judge the living and the dead, and to bring us to Himself in the new heaven and new earth.

Over the long haul, these are God's promises that will sustain and energize us, so that we can run our race with perseverance, no matter how difficult. In the year to come, we have the continued opportunity to trust our heavenly Father, not knowing yet where we go, but knowing His hand is leading us and His love is supporting us. Again, I am grateful for all of you and for your companionship on this journey, and I ask for your ongoing prayers as we all continue that journey together.
